# What are the key signs of Radicalisation?

Talking as if from a scripted speech rather that their own words

Changing their circle of friends

Isolating themselves from family and friends

A sudden disrespectful attitude towards others

Increased levels of anger



Increased secretiveness, especially around internet use

Accessing extremist material online

Using extremist or hate term to exclude others

Writing or creating artwork promoting violent extremist messages

A change in their behaviour

## Radicalisation online- The internet has made it easier for extremists!

- Know who you're talking to
- Don't give out personal information
- Not everything online is true
- Protect children and the vulnerable
- Protect your online reputation
- Know where to find help
- Don't give in to pressure
- Check that content is appropriate
- Only open messages from sources you trust
- •Speak to someone if you feel uncomfortable

### **TERRORISM LAWS**

The following activities are against the law in the UK:

- 1. Encouraging terrorism
- 2. Sharing documents, online posts and any other information that promotes terrorism
- 3. Training for terrorism
- 4. Being involved in the preparation of any acts of terrorism
- 5. Attending a place used for terrorist training
- 6. Making any device (bombs) that could be used in a terrorist attack

These activities carry a range of different punishments, including life imprisonment!
